



**Cooperation Agreement regarding the
Joint Master Degree Program**

between

**TASHKENT STATE UNIVERSITY OF LAW
(REPUBLIC OF UZBEKISTAN)**

and

**UNIVERSITY OF GDANSK
(REPUBLIC OF POLAND)**

This Cooperation Agreement is entered into under the Agreement on cooperation in the development of Joint Master Degree Program signed on __/____/____, between Tashkent State University of Law (TSUL) and University of Gdansk (UG). This Cooperation Agreement outlines the collaborative intentions of the Partner Universities, and commitment to establish and operate Joint Master Degree Program (hereinafter referred to as the Joint Master Program) in accordance with the terms specified herein.

A 'Joint Master Degree Program' is defined as an integrated curriculum coordinated and offered jointly by Tashkent State University of Law (TSUL) and University of Gdansk (UG), leading to the award of two separate joint diplomas, one from each partner university. Upon successful completion of the program, each student will receive a diploma from TSUL and a Master of International Financial Law diploma from UG, thereby recognizing the student's achievement and the dual nature of their studies. This arrangement ensures that graduates are acknowledged for their comprehensive and diverse educational experience, reflecting the collaborative effort and academic standards of both institutions.

The Joint Master Degree Program aims to produce highly qualified professionals for the field of "International Financial Law" by combining the special expertise of Tashkent State University of Law and University of Gdansk those fields.

ART. 1 OBJECTIVE OF THE COOPERATION, PARTNERS, NAME OF DEGREE PROGRAM, DEGREE

1. Tashkent State University of Law (hereinafter TSUL) and University of Gdansk (hereinafter UG) aim to establish lasting and mutually beneficial cooperation. The Universities (hereinafter referred to as "Partners" or "Partner Universities" or "Partner Institutions") agree to establish Joint Master Program under the title "International Financial Law".
2. This cooperation agreement defines the objectives and content of the Joint Master Program, as well as the rights and obligations of the Partners.
3. Graduates who successfully complete the Joint Master Program will be awarded a Master degree.
4. For the compliance with polish regulations - the leading university is the UG. As the leading university, the University of Gdansk (UG) holds the responsibility for overseeing the administrative and academic framework of the Joint Master Degree Program. This leadership role includes coordinating curriculum development, facilitating joint academic activities, and ensuring seamless communication between TSUL and UG.
5. Diplomas upon graduation will be issued independently by each Partner.
6. The qualification awarded by TSUL is 70420116 Financial Legal Monitoring. The qualification awarded by UG is Master of International Financial Law.

ART. 2 LEGAL FRAMEWORK

1. This agreement is signed on the following basis:

TSUL:

- § 7 of Attachment of Decision of the Cabinet of Ministers of the Republic of Uzbekistan "On approval of the regulations on the organization of educational activities based on joint educational programs of higher educational institutions of the Republic of Uzbekistan and foreign partners" of 6 July 2021

UG:

- Law of July 20, 2018 on Higher Education and Science, in particular its Article 60, implementing regulations and internal bylaws.
2. The implementation of the Joint Master Program will adhere to the relevant national and state laws and regulations of the countries where the partner universities are located, especially the Higher Education Acts.
 3. It is agreed that the study programme on which the Joint Master Program is based, have to be certified or accredited at each Partner by the relevant authorities.
 4. The Partners confirm to be authorized to award a degree based on an international Joint Master's Degree.
 5. The organisation of studies at TSUL and UG, as well as the rights and obligations of students, are defined in this Agreement and in detail - in the acts commonly in force in each country as well as internal regulations at each University. While studying at TSUL, the student is bound by the rules applicable at TSUL and at UG by the rules applicable at UG, respectively.

ART. 3 Joint Master Program STRUCTURE, DURATION

1. Students commence the Joint Master Program at TSUL (first and second semesters). Students will proceed with their studies during the third and fourth semesters at UG, culminating in defending their master thesis.

2. The standard Joint Master Program study period is 4 semesters (2 years) full time 120 ECTS credits in total.

ART. 4 MANAGEMENT OF THE DEGREE PROGRAM, COST

1. Each University appoints a Local Academic Coordinator. The following persons are appointed as Local Academic Coordinators:
 - The Dean of the Faculty of Magistracy and Part-time Education Atabek Babadjanov;
 - Head of the Department of Administrative and Financial Law, Prof. Yusupov Sardorbek Bakhodirovich;
 - UG: Prof. Edvardas Juchnevičius.
2. The Local Academic Coordinator from TSUL, in particular:
 - is responsible for the implementation of the Cooperation Agreement at TSUL;
 - attend to the didactic and administrative coordination with the Partners and the creation of an academic calendar for each year;
 - follow the participants from their own University, advising them on their plan of studies and remaining in contact with them for the entire duration of the Joint Master Program;
 - welcome the students and advise them on their studies during their stay;
 - is responsible for the quality control of the Joint Master Program;
 - is the principal contact persons for prospective and enrolled Joint Master Program students, e.g. in case of student complaints;
 - guarantee correct administrative management of the Joint Master Program; this includes the process of selection and admission of students.
3. The Local Academic Coordinator from UG, in particular:
 - is responsible for the implementation of the Cooperation Agreement at UG;
 - welcome the students and advise them on their studies during their stay at UG.
 - advise the students on their plan of studies,
 - is the principal contact persons for the students and remains in contact with them for the entire duration of the Joint Master Program at UG,
 - is the contact person for the Partner University in matters concerning the administration of the Programme
 - is coordinating the creation of an academic calendar for each year at UG,
4. Each University will take care of the costs incurred by its' part of curriculum.
5. No financial settlements shall be made between the partner universities.
6. The Partner Universities may establish joint committees other than the Joint Quality Assurance Committee mentioned in Article. 7, e.g. for program management or for diploma examinations, at

the joint request of local academic coordinators and by the joint decision of the relevant authorities of both Partners.

ART. 5 STUDENT SELECTION, STUDENT ADMINISTRATION, STUDENT STATUS

1. Joint Master Program candidates are required to meet the following admission criteria:
 - Applicants must demonstrate English language proficiency at a B2 level;
 - Applicants are required to hold a bachelor's or master's degree in a relevant field from an accredited institution, as further detailed by TSUL.
2. The Joint Master Program shall enroll a minimum of 30 students each academic year. Enrollment exceeding 50 students will require joint approval from TSUL and UG to ensure the maintenance of program quality and manageability.
3.
 1. TSUL conducts the process of application and selection in compliance with the principles established by Uzbekistan's legal regulations, which specify the examination process in detail. To complement this, the University of Gdansk will participate in the application process, by conducting online interviews as the first stage of the application process. The first stage will consist of an online interview, the purpose of which is to test the candidates' oral English language skills and knowledge of the basic issues related to the subject of the course "International Financial Law"/"Environmental Law and Sustainable Development". Candidates are assessed on the UG grading scale as described in Appendix 2. The interview score represents a minimum of 30% of the total score.
 2. As part of the second stage, by order of TSUL, the Agency for the Assessment of Knowledge and Qualifications under the Ministry of Higher Education, Science and Innovation of the Republic of Uzbekistan is conducting test entrance examinations in English.
4. The transfer of selected students' details between TSUL and UG will adhere to GDPR and respective national data protection laws, ensuring the confidentiality and security of personal information.
5. Throughout their enrollment, students will hold regular student status at both universities.
6. Both universities are responsible for collaborative management ensuring the proper allocation and management of funds for student education.
7. UG is responsible for entering student data into the POLon system (the integrated system of information on science and higher education in Poland). For this purpose, TSUL is obliged to send student data at the request of the UG, including students' personal data after recruitment, information about their status and the number of ECTS points obtained during the first and second semester.

ART. 6 ACADEMIC REGULATIONS AND EXAMINATIONS, EXAMINATION ADMINISTRATION, ACADEMIC GUIDANCE

1. The degree requirements, the expected learning outcomes of the graduates, the mobility path and the modules (name of the courses and corresponding credits), as well as rules concerning the documentation of the conduct of studies are provided as Annex I.
2. The teaching language of the Joint Master Program is English. Examinations including the master's thesis will be held in English. The study will be conducted in a full-time, off-line mode.
3. The master's thesis will be jointly supervised, with one supervisor from each Partner institution. The thesis topic must receive prior approval from both co-supervisors.

4. Credits obtained in accordance with the modalities described in Annex I are recognized by the Partners without further validation.
5. Both Partners will use the ECTS evaluation system. Grades are converted according to the conversion table provided in Annex II. For the modules provided at the UG, an average grade weighted by credit points is calculated on the basis of the Academic Transcript.
6. Students successfully complete the program when they pass the examinations to the courses laid out in Annex I as well as the master's thesis and the thesis defense in accordance with the regulations of the University of Gdańsk Study Regulations
7. Students admitted to the Joint Master Program are expected to maintain a high standard of academic performance and adhere to the rules and regulations of both Partner universities throughout the entire duration of the program.
- 7.1 In the event of a student's failure to meet the academic or behavioral standards set by either Partner university, the disciplinary procedures will be initiated by the appropriate organ according to the regulation of the hosting University.
- 7.2 The Partner universities commit to maintain open and transparent communication regarding expulsion cases, with the aim of ensuring that both universities are informed about the status and circumstances surrounding each student enrolled in the Joint Master Program.
8. Upon successful completion of the Joint Master Program, as regulated in the respective examination regulations of both universities, students will be awarded a master degree. Each university will issue a joint diploma of completion of studies, but the UG in Polish and English, and TSUL in Uzbek and English. The Partner Universities will supply a Diploma Supplement each to all graduating students. The Diploma Supplement must mention that the degree was awarded within a Joint Master Program.
9. At the end of each mobility period, each student will receive a Transcript of Records including the names of the courses, final grades and the number of credits obtained. Each Partner is responsible for issuing the Transcript of Records for their mobility period. Students have to submit the Transcript of Records at the Partner University.
10. Classes in the study will be taught by academic staff and visiting lecturers of both Partners
11. The conduct of the studies and the issuance of all related documents shall be carried out in accordance with the national regulations of the respective countries of the partner universities and the specific regulations of each institution. This ensures that the program not only meets the educational standards set by both TSUL and UG but also adheres to the legal requirements within their respective jurisdictions.
12. Each Partner is required to provide the other Partner with documents relating to each student's records and progress in their studies at the partner university.
13. The diploma examination will be conducted by a Master Exam Joint Committee consisting of 4 members:
 - 1) Chairperson (UG)
 - 2) Thesis supervisor (UG)
 - 3) Co-supervisor of the thesis (TSUL)
 - 4) Reviewer (TSUL).

The examination has an oral form. It consists of three questions developed by the Committee. The questions will be related to the area of knowledge (branch of law) to which the thesis relates and the topic of the thesis.

The exam will be held in an offline format at the premises of the University of Gdansk. Members of the committee from TSUL may participate in the online format.

ART. 7 QUALITY ASSURANCE

1. TSUL and UG commit to the continuous evaluation and improvement of the joint master's program. This will include regular assessments of teaching quality, curriculum relevance, student satisfaction, and graduate outcomes. Both partners will jointly develop and implement an evaluation framework, incorporating feedback from students, faculty, and external stakeholders. Findings from these evaluations will inform ongoing curriculum development, teaching practices, and program management to ensure the program's alignment with academic and professional standards.
2. TSUL and UG agree to form a Joint Quality Assurance Committee, comprising members from each partner's faculty-based quality assurance bodies, tasked with monitoring and maintaining the program's educational standards and quality.
3. Joint Quality Assurance Committee agree upon an annual exchange meeting, regarding the former and current state as well as the prospective development of the Joint Master Program. Results of the national quality assurance procedures can be discussed. Joint Master Program students and alumni are invited to contribute on a voluntary basis.
4. Joint Quality Assurance Committee collects structured student feedback and takes the results into account for the further development of the Joint Master Program.
5. With the aim of supporting the Joint Master Program, the Partners will promote and coordinate by mutual consent the exchange of visiting professors and researchers as well as the organisation of workshop, seminars, conferences and publications on topics of common interest. The above mentioned exchange and the development of the activities will conform to the norms and procedures in force at the Partner.
6. To improve the quality of the Joint Master Program, the Local Academic Coordinators could prepare modifications and propose them to the competent boards of both Universities.
7. At the UG, any change to the program requires an appropriate resolution of the Senate of the UG.

ART. 8 STUDENT SUPPORT

1. To ensure students' quick orientation and integration in the Program as well as to provide detailed information about structural and examination-related requirements, the Partners shall publish corresponding information on the faculty websites outlining the structure of the Joint Master Program in general terms and providing details about the Partner Institutions, in particular: an overview of procedures (including the examination procedures), the time table of the academic year, overall costs of the Joint Master Program and important deadlines, as well as other information which can be of assistance to the students.

2. The Joint Master Program students will benefit from all the services offered by the Partner Institutions to other regular students, e.g. cafeterias, advising, language courses, libraries.
3. The Partner Institutions will provide dormitory accommodation for students. The dormitory fees at UG are not included in the tuition fee.
4. It is an important concern of the Partner Institutions to ensure equal opportunities. They strive to prevent any form of discrimination and to provide adequate support to persons affected by discrimination.

ART. 9 STUDENT FINANCES, INSURANCE

1. Students pay the tuition fees at the TSUL for the first and second semester, and at UG for the third and fourth semester of the Joint Master Program.
2. The fees for the third and fourth semester of the programme, conducted at the UG is being decided and announced by the UG to TSUL through the Local Coordinators, before the start of the recruitment process.

For studying on the 1st and 2nd semesters at TSUL the due is: The tuition fee is determined by multiplying one hundred and forty five times the base calculating amount set by the Republic of Uzbekistan.

For studying on the 3rd and 4th semesters at the University of Gdańsk the tuition fee is: 3600 euro per year

3. Students cover all expenses (e.g. travel, accommodation, cost of living, insurance costs, textbooks) connected with participation in the programme.
4. Students participating in the Joint Master Program will be responsible for providing sufficient proof of insurance in order to get enrolled.
5. Students must provide adequate proof of health insurance and accident insurance for each semester of enrollment.

ART. 10 DATA TRANSFER, DATA PROTECTION

1. The Partners will handle personal data in compliance with the General Data Protection Regulation (EU 2016/679), also known as GDPR. Unless stipulated otherwise, each university will act as an independent data controller as outlined in Article 4 of the GDPR. Personal data of students and staff will be shared between the Partner Universities only as necessary for the execution of the Joint Degree Program. Furthermore, the Partners agree to enter into a supplementary agreement for the cooperative management of personal data associated with the Joint Master Program.
2. The University of Gdańsk informs that its personal data information notice, pursuant to Articles 13(1) and (2) of the GDPR, is accessible at <https://bip.ug.edu.pl/>. TSUL acknowledges having reviewed the notice and commits to meeting the notification requirements outlined in Articles 13 and 14 of the GDPR, for individuals from whom personal data is collected, whether directly or indirectly, for the purpose of entering into and fulfilling this agreement.

ART. 11 PROMOTION OF THE DEGREE PROGRAM

1. Each Partner may use the logos, names and other marks of the other Partner only in connection with the Joint Master Program. Each Partner shall refer to the other Partners' participation in press announcements, marketing and other reasonable promotional activities involving the Joint Master Program through the appropriate use of logos, names and marks of the Partner. The right to use the name and/or logo or any other identifying marks of the other University as described in sentence 1 is limited to the duration of the Cooperation Agreement.
2. Each Partner will make every effort to advertise the Joint Master Program through websites, brochures, flyers and by advertisement.

ART. 12 DURATION AND VALIDITY OF THE AGREEMENT

1. This Cooperation Agreement becomes binding with the last Partner's signature and remains in effect for 4 years. The Cooperation Agreement is automatically extended for another 4 years, if neither Partner gives notice before the end of the original period.
2. This Cooperation Agreement may be terminated at the notice of one of the Partners, provided such a notice is made in writing at least 12 months before termination to become effective. Any students who are already enrolled in the Joint Master Program shall be able to finish their studies according to study's time schedule .
3. An evaluation of this Cooperation Agreement will be initiated by the Local Academic Coordinators at least 12 months prior to its expiration. The agreement is based on long-term strategic cooperation interests from the Partners. The Partners will support and work towards the renewal and extension of this Cooperation Agreement to ascertain the continuation of the Joint Master Program.
4. This Cooperation Agreement is in English language and has been signed in duplicate by the legal representatives of the Partners. Each Partner shall receive one original copy of the fully signed agreement.

ART. 13, CHANGES, SEVERABILITY CLAUSE, MISCELLANEOUS

1. Each Partner may at any time ask in writing for the revision of the Cooperation Agreement. All amendments and additions to this Cooperation Agreement, including the Annexes which shall form an integral part of this Cooperation Agreement, must be made in writing and signed by the legal representatives of the Partners to be effective. The same applies to changes made to this clause. Verbal agreements are invalid and none have been made. Every amendment must be attached to the original copy of this Cooperation Agreement.
2. Annex II (grade conversion tables), is to be updated under the responsibility of the Local Academic Coordinators on a regular basis without amendment of this Cooperation Agreement.
3. In any case, students who are already enrolled in the Joint Master Program must be able to finish their studies according to study's time schedule.
4. It was agreed that the Joint Master's Program cannot be continued if the Partner does not meet the requirements for re-accreditation or is unable to conduct studies as a result of accreditation. In such a case, the Cooperation Agreement is to be changed or expires.
5. If this Cooperation Agreement or any part thereof is found to be illegal or unenforceable, that part will be removed and the illegality or unenforceability shall not affect the untainted parts of this

Cooperation Agreement, which shall continue to be valid and enforceable. Notwithstanding the above, in the event of any such nullification, the Partners shall negotiate in good faith to agree on the terms of a mutually acceptable and satisfactory alternative provision to replace the nullified provision.

ART. 14 SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES, APPLICABLE LAW

In case of difficulties involving the interpretation or execution of this agreement, the Local Academic Coordinators and academic departments shall attempt to resolve the dispute amicably. In the event of non-resolution, the first step is mediation by the Rector of TSUL or her/his delegate/s and by the Rector of UG or her/his delegate/s. Recourse to a court of jurisdiction will be only a last resort, after exhausting all other possibilities. In this case, the conflict will be decided according to the laws of the defendant party.

ART. 15 FINAL PROVISIONS

- 1. The parties are obliged to notify each other in writing of a change in coordinators, addresses, bank details, etc.
- 2. This agreement has been drawn up in 2 copies, each in three languages (English, Uzbek), having equal legal force, one for each of the parties. In case of any doubts regarding the content, the English version prevails.

ART. 16 LEGAL ADDRESSES AND SIGNATURES OF THE PARTIES

- **Understanding International Tax Systems:** They will acquire detailed insights into international tax frameworks, treaties, tax planning strategies, and techniques to avoid double taxation.
- **Grasping Banking and Corporate Financing Regulations:** Graduates will comprehend the principles and regulations related to banking activities, corporate financing, as well as oversight and legal enforcement in financial markets.

- Learning Consumer Protection and Ethical Standards: Students will familiarize themselves with essential consumer protection measures in financial markets and the ethical principles and corporate responsibilities within the finance sector.
- Mastering International Financial Markets: They will possess comprehensive knowledge about the architecture and operation of international financial markets, including the functions of financial institutions, payment systems, and the financial market infrastructure.

The Regulation No. 50/R/22 of the Rector of the University of Gdańsk, dated April 1, 2022, on the principles and procedure for drafting, issuing, exchanging, and authenticating documents related to the completion of studies, as well as the rules for maintaining the diploma book.

In the event of any amendments or changes to the aforementioned legal acts, the partners agree to acknowledge such modifications as valid, provided that the partner universities are notified of these changes within three months following their implementation. This ensures that both universities remain informed of and can comply with the current legal standards governing the documentation of academic achievements in Poland.
